Apportionment for Supply Chain Assistance Funds Fiscal Year 2022–23

This apportionment, in the amount of \$160,165,507 is from funds provided by the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) and authorized under the CCC Charter Act [15 U.S.C. 714]. State allocations were provided to the California Department of Education (CDE) through the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Policy Memo SP 15-2022, Second Allocation of Supply Chain Assistance (SCA) Funds to Alleviate Supply Chain Disruptions in the School Meal Programs. Awards from the CDE are provided to eligible school food authorities (SFA) who submitted an attestation to receive the SCA funds.

Policy Memos SP 15-2022 and SP 16-2022 define eligible SFA recipients as public school districts, county offices of education, charter schools, private nonprofit schools, tribal schools (such as those administered through the Bureau of Indian Education), and Residential Child Care Institutions participating in the USDA National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or School Breakfast Program (SBP) in School Year 2022–23.

Purpose of Funds

The purpose of the SCA funds is to provide relief to SFAs that have experienced widespread and unprecedented challenges in purchasing and receiving food for school meals through their normal distribution channels. Supply chain issues have significantly impacted an SFA's ability to procure nutritious foods for NSLP and/or SBP meal service. Furthermore, food shortages and price increases have made it difficult for SFAs to meet the NSLP/SBP meal pattern requirements.

The SCA funds are a critical source of funding that provides an additional financial resource for SFAs to purchase domestic, unprocessed or minimally processed food products. The SCA funds will also enhance efforts to strengthen local food supply chains throughout California.

Allowable Expenditures

The SCA funds must be used exclusively for the purchase of domestic food products that are unprocessed or minimally processed for use in school meal programs, specifically the NSLP, SBP, SSO, and NSLP Afterschool Snacks.

Examples of allowable food products are:

- Fluid milk
- Cheese
- Yogurt
- Fruits and vegetables (including 100 percent juices)
- Grain products such as pastas and rice
- Meats (whole, pieces, or food items such as ground meats)
- Beans
- Legumes
- Foods in a wide variety of minimal processing states (e.g., whole, cut, pureed, etc.) and/or forms (e.g., fresh, frozen, canned, dried, etc.)

Incidental costs (such as those related to shipping and handling or packaging) that are a part of the normal or customary purchase price charged by a vendor for any given food product are also an allowable use of SCA funds. SCA funds may only be used for current/future expenses.

Funding Amounts and Financial Management

The amount awarded to each SFA is based on a predetermined formula set by the USDA. The predetermined formula includes two components: a base payment of \$5,000 to all eligible SFAs, and a proportional funding amount based on each SFA's share of statewide student enrollment.

The SCA funds must be deposited into the nonprofit food service account of the SFA for which the funds were intended. SCA funds may only be used for the purposes for which they are awarded.

Procurement Guidelines

At minimum, SFAs must follow all applicable procurement processes and guidelines, which may include, but are not limited to:

- Complying with all existing recordkeeping and review requirements per Title 7, Code of Federal Regulations (7 CFR), 210.9(b)(17) and 7 CFR, 210.18, which includes maintaining documentation demonstrating appropriate use of the funds.
- Complying with all applicable federal procurement and financial management requirements per Title 2, *CFR*, 200.

Reporting

SFAs are required to retain supporting documentation that demonstrates how these funds were expended. Supporting documentation must be consistent with the regular program recordkeeping requirements. The use of SCA funds will be reviewed and monitored as part of the School Nutrition Program administrative review.

Expenditure Deadline

There is currently no deadline to expend SCA funds, however, the funds are intended to provide timely relief of the widespread supply chain issues, so SFAs are encouraged to spend the funds on allowable expenses rather than save them.
